VOLUNTEER DAY SATURDAY

After the annual winter break, our monthly Friends of Duboce Park Volunteer Day resumes this Saturday, March 8, from 10 a.m. to noon. We will be weeding and mulching the Scott Street planting beds around the Scott Street Labyrinth and Recreation Center. Please sign up here so we know how many people to expect. This will be our first volunteer day in 2025.



In 2024, the department hosted 11,720 volunteers in our parks and programs at 870 events in San Francisco parks. Volunteers contribute more than 250,000 hours of service each year in San Francisco's more than 230 parks and recreation facilities, which represents an invaluable contribution to our city through activities like planting California native and drought-tolerant plants, teaching Zumba at a local Rec Center, or painting faces at special events.

As part of the celebration, Friends of Duboce Park is holding a t-shirt design contest that captures the spirit of Duboce Park. The winner will be awarded \$100


and have their art featured on a limited-addition commemorative Duboce Park t-shirt that will be sold to raise funds for the event.

Does your child love to make art all day long? Then this is the camp for them! The Harvey Milk Summer Camps are visual and performing arts camps. Rec & Park offers intensive art-making and performing where campers aged 7 to 11 can explore and develop their artistic abilities in visual and digital art, storytelling, dance, or theatre, led by art specialists. Projects will focus on multistep processes and challenge fine motor skills.

SALT OF THE EARTH PHOTO SHOW

The opening reception of the Salt of the Earth photo show at the Harvey Milk Photo Center is Saturday, March 15 from 2 to 5 p.m. A book signing and artist talk will be held on Saturday, April 5 at 2 p.m.

Since the 1800s, the ecosystems of the tidal marshes have been replaced by salt ponds. In her new book, Salt of the Earth: A Visual Odyssey of a Transforming Landscape (Kehrer), California-based photographer Barbara Boissevain documents the efforts being made to return these spaces to their natural state. Boissevain set out to document humanity's impact on the environment and raise awareness of the need for preserving pristine spaces.

MAINTENANCE UPDATE

The fence around the Dog Play Area has been removed, and the lawn looks better now than in years. A smaller fence is now around the bare area near the Potomac Street entrance to allow that area to become green again.

Two new benches that match the existing benches in the park will soon be placed near the Pierce Street entrance.

A new water fountain to replace the damaged one at the northwest corner of the Dog Play Area has been ordered and will be installed soon. We are still waiting for an update on repainting the Children's Playground equipment, which has faded or been worn away from heavy use.

COYOTES ARE EVERYWHERE

Coyotes are everywhere, including in and around Duboce Park. Two coyotes entered the Central Subway tunnel near Fourth and Bryant streets before dawn on January 27 and headed north. The coyotes then heading south past the Union Square and Yerba Buena stations and back out of the tunnel on Fourth St.

SF Animal Care and Control logs hundreds of reports of coyote encounters yearly, ranging from simple sightings to attacks on pets and, rarely, humans.

Animal Care and Control has
published advice for residents on
handling coyote encounters — starting
with the recommendation to walk away
from the animals when you see them.







PARK PROBLEM - WHO TO CALL

Call 911 immediately if there is a crime in progress or any other emergency that requires a police, fire, or medical response. If a situation requires the

police, but does not need an immediate response, call (415) 553-0123. Examples of non-emergency situations include noise complaints, suspicious activities, or a homeless/nuisance- related issues.

If there is a problem in the park that is not an emergency, call the Park Rangers at (415) 242-6390. Use this number for park code violations, such as noise, dogs in the People Only Area, and permit violations. Park Rangers only respond to non-emergency calls. In 2003, there were just 15 rangers but there are now 53 on their staff.
