# 125TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION – SEPTEMBER 13

Duboce Park turns 125 this year. To celebrate the occasion, Friends of Duboce Park is hosting a celebration in the park on Saturday, September 13, 2025, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Save the date and plan a day of fun.

Here are the activities planned: 40-foot obstacle jump house, arts and crafts, dodgeball tournament, scavenger hunt, lawn games, photo booth, historical photo display, face painting, henna, dog adoption (Muttville), history table, live music, paper airplane contest, fire engine, police car, Randall Museum on the Road, and food trucks.

The photo display will include pictures of Duboce Park before the 1906 Earthquake and

Fire, the tent city in the park right after the Earthquake, photos of the park before the Harvey Milk Recreation Center, and before and after photos of the Children's Playground, the Youth Play Area, and the Scott Street Labyrinth. Special guests include Mayor Daniel Lurie, State Senator Scott Weiner, Supervisor Rafael Mandelman, and Park and Rec General Manager Phil Ginsburg, who will all participate in planting a new tree in honor of our 125th Anniversary.

# **FILM CAMERA BASICS**

This one-evening, hands-on class covers the basics in film camera usage starting with properly loading your film, exposure, depth of field basics and more. It is being offered on Tuesday, July 29, from 6 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Students should bring their film camera and a roll of film. 35 mm and medium format (120) will be covered. Film development and darkroom printing are not covered in this course.

Photo Center Orientation is not required for this class, but it is required if student wishes to come to the Photo Center outside the workshop to develop film on their own and/or print their own photos in the Darkroom. There are many other great photography courses also being offered at the Photo Center.

#### **MAINTENANCE UPDATE**

Graffiti seems to be a regular problem in the park, particularly on the north side of the Recreation Center and on the Youth Play Area of the Muni wall. It is almost always removed within one or two days of notifying Rec and Park.

A new water fountain to replace the damaged one at the northwest corner of the Dog Play Area has been ordered and will be installed soon. Two of the three fountains do still work.





We are waiting for an update on repainting the Children's Playground equipment, which has faded or been worn away from heavy use.

The green structure supporting the tot swings has been repainted and a work order to repaint the rest of the equipment is in the system.

Two new benches that match existing benches in the park will be installed near the benches near the Pierce Street entrance soon.

## COYOTE PUPPING SEASON

As we hit the dog days of summer, it means that we're in the midst of coyote pupping season. While coyotes are generally wary of humans, parent coyotes may become territorial if you or your pet stumbles upon their den.

Here's **advice** from Animal Care and Control:

To foster a safe coexistence between yourself and our natural neighbors, please take the following precautions:

- Keep dogs on leashes in our parks, unless in a designated off-leash dog play area.
- Only admire coyotes from a distance

Never feed coyotes or any wildlife.



If you encounter a coyote, slowly back away carrying any small children or pets. Do not run. You may also scare the coyote away by appearing large and making loud noises.

Call 911 immediately if there is a crime in progress or any other emergency that requires a police, fire, or medical response. If a situation requires the police, but does not need an immediate response, call (415) 553-

0123. Examples of non-emergency situations include noise complaints, suspicious activities, or a homeless/nuisance- related issues.

If there is a problem in the park that is not an emergency, call the Park Rangers at (415) 242-6390. Use this number for park code violations, such

as noise, dogs in the People Only Area, and permit violations. Park Rangers only respond to non-emergency calls. In 2003, there were just 15 rangers but there are now 53 on their staff.
